



STOP QUICK CHECK LIST MY TAP WATER...

- tastes or smells woody or like pencil wood
- tastes or smells better after running the tap for a few minutes



The taste or smell comes from some of the first black plastic pipes commonly used in the 1960's and 1970's as supply pipes - the pipe on your property that links you to the mains supply.

The black plastic pipe is called alkathene. It can sometimes make the water taste or smell woody over time.

Woody tastes and odours are not harmful.

WHAT TO DO NOW

Flushing the taps for a few minutes before using water for drinking should reduce the taste.

This clears any water that has been standing in contact with your supply pipe. In the long term, you can only get rid of the taste by replacing your pipework.

A plumber can help you identify the material of your supply pipe and advise on what to do next.
