BOATING CLOSE TO BATHING AND SHELLFISH WATERS

We recognise that finding local marina and harbour amenity pump out facilities in the region can be difficult and that not all boats have holding tanks. However, making a few small changes when you are using your boat could help to safeguard the bathing waters and shellfish beds around our region.

DID YOU KNOW?

Sewage pollution can put bacteria into coastal waters which poses a potential health risk for people who use the water for activities such as swimming and diving.

Raw sewage also reduces the amount of oxygen available for aquatic animals including fish and invertebrates.

GOOD PRACTICE HOW TO DO YOUR BIT

- Plan ahead use shore facilities before and after your trip whenever possible. This will avoid the need to use on-board toilets.
- 2 Use your holding tank if you have one, but only discharge it at a marina or harbour pump out facility or more than 12 nautical miles offshore.
- **3** Let your local marina/harbour authority know if you would use a sewage pump out facility if there was one.

Use a portable chemical toilet - but plan ahead where you will empty it as they use toxic substances that only a few pump out facilities will accept. Never empty chemical toilets into drains.



Because it's untreated sewage, a one flush from a boat contains the same amount of bacteria as 250,000 flushes through the sewage treatment process!
